<p>Foundations for Freedom (F4F) www.f-4-f.org</p>	<p>A training programme created in 1993 for young leaders in Central and Eastern Europe in the values which underlie a truly free society at all levels of government.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Taking a 10 to 20-year perspective, F4F offers a variety of courses and seminars. • A range of follow-up training opportunities aims to build local teams able to impact national life.
<p>Hope in the Cities (HIC) www.hopeinthecities.org</p>	<p>This programme was launched in Virginia, USA, in 1990 to address the issue of racial healing.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Its goal is to create diverse teams which will work for justice and reconciliation within their own communities across the divides between racial, ethnic and religious groups. • It offers various dialogue modules on subjects such as public policy engagement, multi-faith dialogues and action to impact education. It also facilitates training for dialogue leadership and management.
<p>Caux Initiatives for Business (CIB) www.cauxinitiativesforbusiness.org</p>	<p>Since 1973, CIB has engaged business people and decision-makers in honest conversations on the broad issues associated with globalization. Motivated by a mutual commitment to address economic problems of immediate or long-term concern including environmental imbalances and social exclusion.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CIB carries forward its aims through annual conferences at Caux-Switzerland. The next global CIB conference will take place in Panchgani, India.
